To Our Friends in Our Peer Communities:



The [Town of Canmore](#) is a community of 13,000 permanent residents in the Bow River Valley of Alberta. An hour's drive from Calgary, the community is one of Canada's premiere centers for tourism, health & wellness, and winter sports. Canmore lies at the gateway to [Banff National Park](#) and hosts 4.5 million visitors annually. [Banff-Sunshine Village](#), [Norquay](#), [Nakiska](#), and [Lake Louise](#) offer downhill skiing nearby. The [Canmore Nordic Centre](#) offers 60 km of cross-country skiing trails, 4 km of which are illuminated for night skiing.
