

PROCLAMATION
2018 FALL CLEAN-UP (Yard-Waste Disposal)
and BURN WEEK

WHEREAS, it is customary in the fall of each year to declare a burn week for citizens of the Town of Jackson to use controlled burns to clean up their property by burning only dry grass, leaves, twigs, small branches, and clean wood; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Jackson and Teton County Integrated Solid Waste and Recycling have partnered to create the 4th Annual Fall Clean-Up with the common goal to encourage residents to divert yard-waste from the trash stream so that it may be composted locally, rather than hauled to the landfill; and

WHEREAS, citizens may use free compostable paper bags to collect their yard waste that are available beginning October 22nd at Town Hall, Public Works and the Recycling Center; and

WHEREAS, a convenient location will be established at the rodeo grounds for residents wishing to participate in the **Fall Yard-Waste Disposal**, may drop off their yard waste on **November 2nd and 3rd** between 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM; and


WHEREAS, Residents are also encouraged to participate in the **3rd Annual Pumpkin Smash**, a community event that enables citizens to drop off their jack-o-lanterns for free composting at the Rodeo Grounds on **November 4th** between 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Pete Muldoon, Mayor of the Town of Jackson, do hereby proclaim **October 28th through November 3rd** as **Fall Burn Week** and remind citizens to contact the Jackson Hole Law Enforcement Agency at 733-2331 prior to starting outside burns; and

FURTHER, I do designate **November 2nd and 3rd** as **Fall Clean-Up** and encourage citizens to participate in this community event


