REASON FOR CONTACT

Officer stopped vehicle for speeding.

SUMMARY

Officer stopped vehicle and driver got out and walked quickly away. Officer used verbal commands, identifying himself as a police officer and telling him to stop. Driver did not stop. Officer grabbed driver by the arm. Subject attempted to pull away from officer. Officer and back-up officer used control holds to detain subject who continued to struggle and stabilized him against their police car to maintain their control for handcuffing and searching.

Driver claimed injury to shoulder and head.

No injury to officer.

***LEGEND**

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds and include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter, (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal munitions: Beanbag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser.

Knives: Deadly force option.

Firearms: Deadly force option.

Vehicles: Deadly force option.
