SUMMARY OF USE OF FORCE INCIDENT AND FINDINGS BY THE JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

FORCE TYPE*

Potential injury in custody

REASON FOR CONTACT:

On 11/22/2020 at 0000 hours a Jackson Police officer saw a vehicle at the intersection of Flat Creek and Karns with the brake lights activated, stopped in the middle of the intersection. The vehicle also had white light shining toward the rear of the vehicle. The driver was later arrested for driving under the influence.

The officer on scene took the occupant into custody without incident. As the officers were trying to load the occupant, who is 6'8" tall, weighing 220 lbs., into the vehicle he was seated in the rear portion of the vehicle and as the officer closed the rear door, he closed it and jammed the occupant's knee between the door panel and prisoner transport cage. When the officer closed the door, he immediately heard the occupant yell out in pain. This caused the officer to open the door, resituate the occupant and then proceed without further incident to transport the occupant to the detention facility.

Photographs were taken of the occupant's knee, showing no injuries. The occupant also did not complain of any prolonged pain from the door.

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
