Soft-hand Techniques: Ground Stabilization

REASON FOR CONTACT:

On October 19, 2020 at 0330 hours, officers were called by the reporting party to a local apartment complex for a male who was causing a disturbance. The reporting party stated the male had been banging on her window, was screaming and yelling and was pacing in the courtyard of the apartment complex. The male was arrested for public intoxication.

When the officer tried to put the suspect into handcuffs he tried pulling away from the officer. The officer attempted to use a door for a static surface to stabilize the suspect without success. The suspect was then taken to the ground so handcuffs could be safely applied by the officer

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
