SUMMARY OF USE OF FORCE INCIDENT AND FINDINGS BY THE JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

REASON FOR CONTACT

Jackson Police Department officers were dispatched to a local bar to investigate a disturbance.

Upon their arrival officers were presented with an intoxicated individual outside of the bar talking with one of the managers. The officers learned the male had been asked to leave the establishment but refused to do so. The officers learned about a \$150.00 unpaid bar tab as well. During this interaction the male started yelling and cursing at the bar manager. The officers attempted to separate the man from the manager and while doing so asked the man for his identification. The male refused to provide ID and attempted to push past officers. The male was arrested for interference with a police officer.

After the fact the male complained to the detention staff that he was injured by handcuffs during the arrest.

Injury to male: complaint of pain to the wrists

Injury to officers: None

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
