## SUMMARY OF USE OF FORCE INCIDENT BY THE JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

### REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

On January 23, 2022 at 0202 hours a JPD Corporal (Cpl.) was conducting a bar check at a local establishment when a fight broke out in the courtyard.

With the assistance of another officer, the Cpl. began investigating. A male subject who was not in the fight began interfering with the officer's investigation by physically placing himself between the officer and the subject he was attempting to interview. The subject put his arm out in between the two, in an attempt to separate them.

The JPD Corporal observed this and moved to intervene. The Cpl. Told the subject to get out of the way multiple times. The subject refused to move and was physically shuffled away by the Cpl. As the Cpl. attempted to address the other involved party, the subject attempted to throw a left jab toward the Cpl.'s face. The Cpl. and a nearby JPD Sergeant (Sgt.) attempted to use a wall to stabilize the subject to handcuff him. The subject bucked and bowed his body and tried to wrench away. The Cpl. pulled the subject away from the wall and used a leg sweep to take the subject to the ground where he was handcuffed.

### \*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
