SOFT HAND TECHNIQUE – HANDCUFFING COMPLAINT OF INJURY

REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

On 3/10/2022 at 1811 hours as part of an on-going narcotics investigation JPD officers and detectives served a search warrant on a residence.

During the search warrant the resident of the home was discovered inside of the house. The male subject had an active warrant for his arrest from the earlier mentioned case.

A JPD Sergeant took the male subject into custody for the warrant. The sergeant applied handcuffs without incident and the male subject was placed into a waiting patrol car for transport to the detention center. While at the detention center's outer door the male subject asked the transporting officer "Is it normal for hands to fall asleep?" The officer and the male subject engaged in conversation about handcuffs and the officer asked the male subject if he can "hang tight" until they get into the detention center. The male subject responded to the officer "that's fine, thank you."

Once inside the detention center the subject made a complaint of injury from the handcuffing to the detention staff. The incident was investigated by a supervisor per policy.

Injury to male: REDNESS AND SWELLING ON THE WRIST

Injury to officers: NONE

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
