SUMMARY OF USE OF FORCE INCIDENT BY THE JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

On March 15, 2022, at 0611 hours JPD Officer were dispatched to a local apartment building to investigate a call of a man being stabbed in the face. Upon arrival the officers observed the bloody male victim holding a towel to his face. Officers also observed another male subject that appeared to have blood on his shirt and pants.

The officers attempted to speak to the male subject, he spoke to them briefly and then attempted to re-enter the apartment. OfficerS determined the male subject was likely the person who stabbed the male victim. They moved to detain him by grabbing on to him. The male subject began to pull away from the officers. The officers could not get the subject's hands behind his back due to his active physical resistance. The subject was flexing and pulling away from the officers. One officer went to place the subject on the ground to handcuff him. During that maneuver the subject ended up on top of the officer attempting the takedown. The subject then attempted to remove the officer's Taser from the holster. The other officer put the subject in a rear "seat belt" maneuver, and then rolled over backward with the subject. The officer then wrapped the subject with his legs to control the subject. The subject was successfully handcuffed at that point.

The subject was charged with multiple felonies including attempted murder in the second degree, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, possession of a deadly weapon with felonious intent, felonious restraint.

Injury to male: NONE

Injury to officers: SCRAPES AND BRUISES

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option
