REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

Two officers observed a male walking in an erratic manner having a silent screaming conversation with himself. The officers were concerned for the male's welfare. When contacting the male, he swung a pickleball racket at them and then took off running. Officers pursued and determined he was having some sort of manic episode. Medics were called, and the 26-year-old Jackson male was taken to the hospital.

While attempting to subdue the male he was taken to the ground for handcuffing and stabilization.

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
