SUMMARY OF USE OF FORCE INCIDENT BY THE JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

SOFT HAND TECHNIQUE – GROUND STABILIZATION

REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

On 11/03/2022 at approximately 0916 hours, a Jackson Police Department (JPD) officer observed a Wyoming Highway Patrol (WHP) trooper conducting a traffic stop. The JPD officer pulled over to see if the trooper needed any assistance or a cover officer. As the JPD officer arrived the WHP trooper began to struggle with the driver of the vehicle, who was later identified as a 32-year-old Jackson man. The JPD officer helped control the driver's hands, and eventually utilized a take down to stabilize the driver on the ground until the scene was safe. The driver was taken to the hospital and was later discharged with no apparent injuries.

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
