REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

On December 13, 2022, at 2214 hours, officers were dispatched to a bar for a subject who refused to leave after being told to do so many times. Officers contacted the 24-year-old Jackson resident and told him to leave the establishment, but he would not. Officers explained why he needed to leave but he remained in the building still. Officers told the male he was under arrest for criminal trespass and the male actively resisted arrest. The male was taken to the ground to facilitate handcuffing. During the scuffle a CEW deployment was made on the male to gain compliance but failed. The male was taken into custody after other officers arrived to assist. The subject was charged with criminal trespass and interference with a peace officer.

*LEGEND

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
