REASON FOR CONTACT AND FORCE USED

On 03/26/2023 at approximately 0015 hours a 27-year-old male Jamestown, North Dakota resident was arrested for public intoxication. Officers who responded to a bar on an unrelated incident, observed the male try and engage in a physical altercation with another male at the front of the bar. Police Officers intervened to thwart the physical altercation and put the male on the ground for handcuffing. It was determined the male was under the influence of alcohol in a place open to the public and engaging in behavior that was disturbing the public peace and endangering himself and others.

***LEGEND**

Soft-hand techniques: Physical restraint and control holds to include ground and/or fixed surface stabilization.

Hard-hand techniques: Strikes, kicks, and throws.

Chemical agents: OC Spray or CS Gas.

Impact tools: Straight stick or expandable baton.

Improvised tools: Any object used in a sudden defensive encounter (flashlight, ticket book, etc.)

Less-lethal impact munitions: Drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

Conducted Energy Weapon: Taser

Knives: Deadly Force Option

Firearms: Deadly Force Option

Vehicles: Deadly Force Option
